THE HOMILY FOR THE SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT- "A" [Gen. 12: 1-4; 2 Tim. 1: 8-10; Mat. 17: 1-9]

My dear friends,

We know that God is in-charge of everything. He has the capacity to protect us and He has the self-control to let us go as we want, but He never forsakes us. He has said, "Neither will I forsake you nor will I abandon you" (Jos. 1:5). We see, in today's first reading, our God giving an opportunity to Abram to trust in Him with the promises of blessings and prosperity. God's promise was not only for Abram, but even for us too. In our trust in God, like the rose among thorns, we will face challenges, sufferings and frustrations in life. When we are faced with these challenges, we should not be afraid or doubt and say, "The Lord has forgotten me." Our sufferings and hardships are a sharing in the sufferings of the Lord and a passage to the glory with which the Lord will crown us in the end. In Rom. 8: 17 Paul says, "If indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory." Leaving his country and going to an unknown nation was not an easy thing for Abram, but He trusted in God and kept his mind fixed on the promises of God. He never let his mind wander away from God. This gave him the courage to challenge the way of the world and undertake any amount of sufferings in his life. In today's second reading, Paul says, "Take your share of suffering for the gospel in the

your share of suffering for the gospel in the power of God" (2 Tim. 1: 8). We know that Paul wrote this from his own experience because he suffered a lot of cruelty and hardship in his life. In spite of all his sufferings, if he said this, it is clear that he had found meaning in his sufferings. He believed that his sufferings would cleanse him from his sins and lead him to the glory that the Lord had promised to Abraham. Moreover, he knew that it is through His

suffering and death on the cross that the Lord led the world to the glory of the resurrection. That is why I believe that Peter said in his First Letter that suffering is a grace from God and so without cursing Him, our Creator, we should keep doing the good work we do (4:19). It will help us to receive the crown of glory in the end. In the same Letter Peter again said very encouragingly, "However if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear His name" (1 Pet. 4:6). In today's second reading, Paul is asking us that if Jesus has abolished death through His sufferings, will He not lead us to the glory of His resurrection? In Jn. 16: 33 Jesus said, "In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world." Before going to Jerusalem to embrace the path of crucifixion, Jesus had predicted three times about His sufferings and death. He had also told His Disciples about His glorious resurrection. In order to strengthen the spirit of the Apostles, He took Peter, James and John up to the mountain and transfigured or manifested His glory and the joy in which they would be participating because of their witness to the gospel. By this Jesus had clearly indicated that making use of our own sufferings in the world, we must prepare ourselves to cleanse our souls and attain the glory and the joy of everlasting life. Then, when our appointed time comes, we can stand erect to embrace the crown of salvation prepared for us at the end of our earthly journey. When someone dear to us dies, we always like to hear something good about that person. It is natural and always good to hear about good things. But do we hear anything about that person's remarkable story of the journey of faith in the Lord? "Take courage! It is I, do not be afraid," (Mt. 14: 27) says the Lord. Let us kiss the cross boldly and it will lead us to joy. We pray! May the Holy Spirit guide us all! Amen.
